

Southwest 1 By TY Tan

In the last instalment of *Feng Shui for Golfers*, I wrote about the *feng shui* of properties facing the first third sector of South (between 157.5 degrees and 172.5 degrees). In this issue, let's discuss the fortunate *feng shui* settings of houses facing the first third sector of Southwest (between 202.5 degrees and 217.5 degrees).

Properties facing between 202.5 degrees to 217.5 degrees built after February 2004 are in an extremely good direction. It would be very fortunate if they have the following:

1. Good external landscape

- It is very fortunate to have a big, beautiful, natural water body located in the Southwest direction of the house and a big, beautiful, natural mountain to the Northeast.
- It is even more fortunate if the beautiful water in the Southwest stretches to cover the area to the South and Southeast and the big, beautiful, natural mountain in the Northeast direction stretches to cover the North, Northwest and West.




Figure 1 - Good external landscape

2. Good internal layout

- The best location for the main front door is in the Southwest section of the house.
- There must be a back door in the North direction.
- There must be an open centre, so the facing and sitting positions are well connected. But the front section (SW) and the back section (NE) must not be in a straight path.
- The house will be even more fortunate if the South, East and Northwest sections of the house are well connected and the Southeast, North and West sections of the house are also well connected.
- The best sector to place an internal water feature, such




Figure 2 - Good internal layout

as an aquarium, to further enhance wealth luck is in the Southwest section of the house.

3. Colour scheme

To balance the *qi* of the house, use the following colour schemes:

- Yellow or brown for the

- North sector
- Dark blue or black for the Southeast and East sectors

A building with the above settings has extremely good *feng shui* for those residing in it in terms of wealth, health, relationships, career advancement and descendants.
